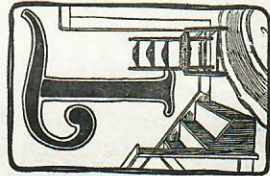

THE HOUSE OF MANY STAIRS, at Pennsdale will be open for your pleasure from May thirty-first till September first, after which it will cease to be a Tea House and return to its real status, a home. So this year do try to see it. In order that children may enjoy it too, there will be swings and a sandpile in the orchard; benches and tables will be under the trees. You may come to lunch, tea, or dinner, to cards, to talk, to walk, and to see the house.

In case you have not heard of the house and its history before receiving this notice, it is a little stone house, built on the side of a hill. The earliest known date connected with it is 1790. It was then an old inn, "The Bull's Head Tavern," a protection for people during Indian massacres and raids, later a resort for highwaymen and horse thieves. And the next story is of the hiding here of runaway slaves.

There will be a choice of the quaint old kitchen with its huge fireplace, the bar room with its ancient bottle cupboards, the inn parlor, the garden, or the orchards for your amusement and refreshment.
